Overview

The Government of Mexico (GOM) has a prominent role in Mexico's standards system. The Secretariat of Economy (Secretaría de Economía or SE), through the General Standards Bureau (Dirección General de Normas or DGN), is the organization with the authority to manage and coordinate standards.

Standards are official rules, technical specifications, guidelines and definitions that ensure that materials, products, processes, and services are harmonized and standardized. Mexican standardization procedures are established by the Methodology and Standardization Law, as well as sector and. In Mexico, the regulatory framework for standards is grounded in the country's Constitution, designed to protect public safety, health, consumer rights, and natural resources.
