Free-standing shelves can be accessible from either one or both longer length sides. A standard shelf system typically consists of three foundational elements: the shelf board (the horizontal surface), the support structure (such as brackets or standards), and the fasteners (screws, anchors, or bolts) which secure the support structure to the wall or ceiling. They provide a finished look and prevent any sharp edges from causing damage or injury. Tube caps also help to maintain the structural integrity of the shelving unit by keeping dirt and debris out of the joints.
